UNWINDING COULD BE REWOUND-----

From May 11, schools will gradually reopen and businesses will be free to resume operations as the country's 67 million population comes out from the confinement in which they have been since mid-March. The government has said it is prepared to slow or delay the unwinding of the lockdown if the virus infection rate spikes markedly higher, with administrative departments divided into "red" and "green" zones. Opposition legislators and some experts have questioned the practicalities of schools reopening, the broad use of public transport and the tough measures that will continue to affect areas less affected by the virus. Question marks have also been raised about the government's ability to reach its target of 700,000 COVID-19 tests by May 11, their implementation and the possible isolation of people who tested positive for the illness.
